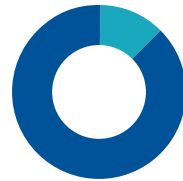
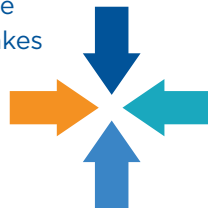

ARI puts science first.

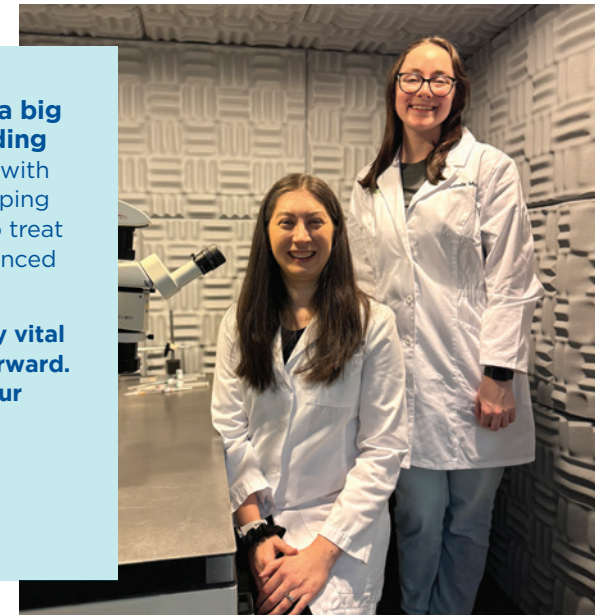
Our grant program aims to fund innovative research while facilitating the knowledge transfer of evidence-based information while generating and sharing peer-reviewed scientific findings.

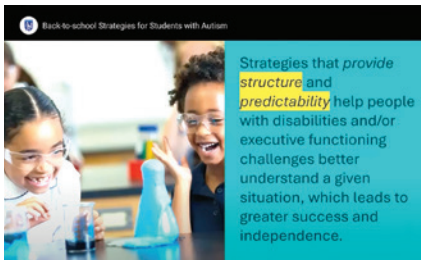

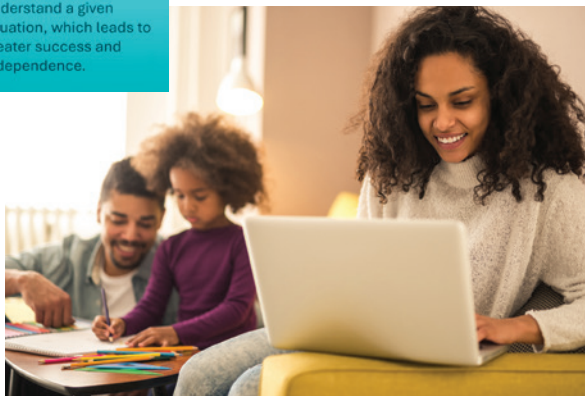

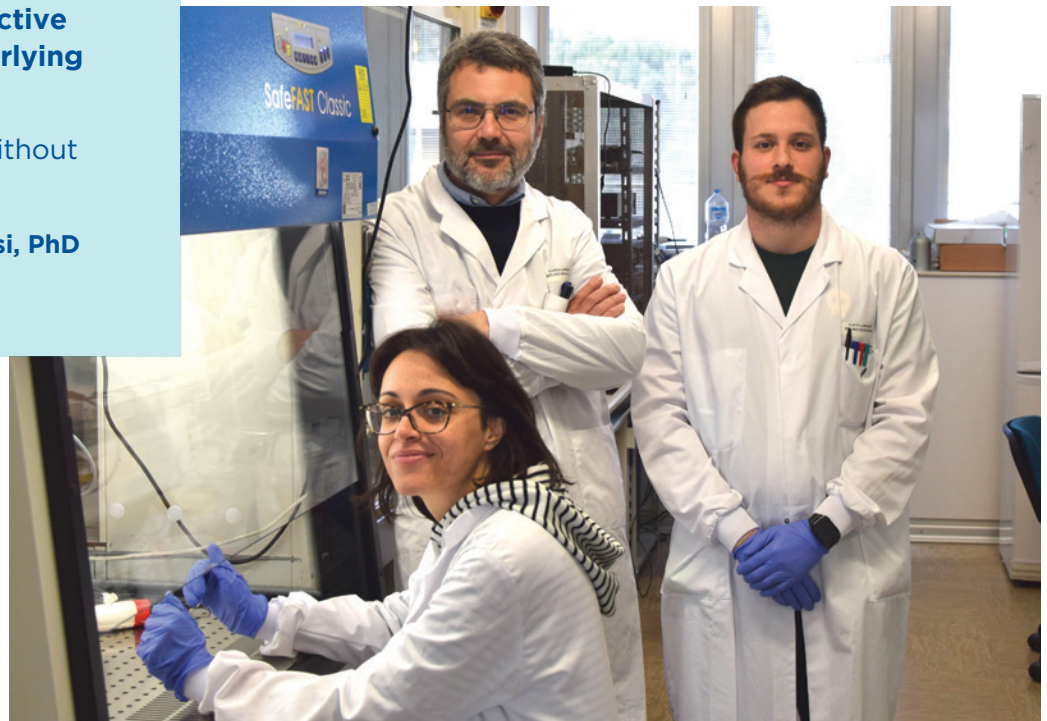
